



Moody Gardens® Penguin and Pinnipeds Internship Application

Thank you for your interest in the Moody Gardens® Penguins and Pinnipeds Internship Program. Please note that this is an unpaid internship and housing/food/travel stipends are not provided. Interns must commit to a regular schedule (16-20hrs per week in the fall and spring) (20-40hrs per week in the summer) for a short-term period of at least 3 months.

Application Schedule:

Spring Internship:	January-March Applications accepted until December 1 st . Start by January 15 th
Summer Internship:	June-August Applications accepted until May 1 st . Start by June 1 st
Fall Internship:	September-November Applications accepted until August 31 st Start by September 20 th

As the internship is unpaid, Moody Gardens® does not provide any medical coverage for on or off the job injuries or incidents. *Please note – for internships under 30 hours the primary focus will be on penguins with limited pinniped exposure.*

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Internship Application Information

To apply for an internship within the Penguins and Pinnipeds section at Moody Gardens® you must:

1. Be currently enrolled as a sophomore or higher in an accredited college or university.
2. Have a minimum of one year course work in a major field of study to be applied during the internship.
3. Be receiving course credit for the internship.
4. Must have a minimum 3.0 GPA at the time of internship.
5. Submit an application.
6. Submit a cover letter.
7. Submit a resume.
8. Submit answers to the application questions.
9. Submit an unofficial or official copy of your current transcripts.
10. Submit **two** letters of recommendations (**one must be from an academic advisor or professor**).
11. Submit a letter from your course professor stating the course for which the internship will credit along with his/hers contact information.
12. Undergo a phone, online, or on-site interview based off current geographic location.
13. Commit to 16-20 hours a week for 12 weeks for the fall or spring internship program and a 20-40 hours a week for 10 weeks during the summer internship.
 - a. *Please note – for internships under 30 hours the primary focus will be on penguins with limited pinniped exposure.*
14. Must be able to pass a background check.
15. Meet expectations as outlined under 'Internship Expectations'

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Penguins and Pinnipeds Internship

Goal of Internship:

The internship will provide the applicant with an introduction into penguin and pinniped husbandry, exhibit maintenance, positive reinforcement training and environmental enrichment. At the end of the internship the applicant will have a basic knowledge of the above skills and techniques as well as a basic understanding of the biology of penguins and pinnipeds.

Intern Benefits:

- Learn daily husbandry and nutrition of a diverse collection of penguins and pinnipeds.
- Learn positive reinforcement and environmental enrichment techniques.
- Learn proper food preparation techniques and understand system diets.
- Learn common and scientific names of penguins and Pinnipeds.
- Work closely with aquarium biologists and interact with guests.
- Moody Gardens Annual Pass after completion of internship.

Intern Expectations/ Responsibilities:

- Must be on-time!
- Work 16-20 hours a week for at least 12 weeks in fall/spring semesters and 20-40 hours a week for 10 weeks in summer semester. *Please note – for internships under 30 hours the primary focus will be on penguins with limited pinniped exposure.*
- Set schedule prior to the start of the internship with morning shifts running from 8:00am to 12:00pm and afternoon shifts running from 1:00pm to 5:00pm.
- Capability of lifting a minimum of 50 pounds, climbing ladders, stairs, and work around saltwater.
- Limited animal handling. No petting or playing with any of the animals is allowed! Work Safety!
- Interactions with Moody Gardens® visitors. Be prepared to answer questions from the public.
- Must complete online courses and course evaluations.
- Must attend two one-hour long continuing education class sessions.
- Must turn in a Daily Log of experience.
- Be prepared to work in all weather conditions.

Intern Dress:

- An Intern uniform shirt and nametag will be provided.
- Wear khaki pants or shorts (no shorter than an inch above the knee, no capris or cargos allowed) and comfortable brown, black or white close toed shoes provided by the intern.
- A black or brown belt must be worn.
- All clothing must be presentable with no holes or rips.
